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## About the School

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International Indian School Jeddah formerly known as Embassy of India School is an Elementary and Secondary School for the children of Indian Nationals in Jeddah, Saudi Arabia with boys and girls taught separately in English. It was founded in 1969 and it is part of a constellation of International Indian Schools under the patronage of the Ambassador of India, Riyadh. The school is licensed by the Ministry of Education, KSA and affiliated to the Central Board of Secondary Education, New Delhi.

IISJ visualizes peace and intellectual development within the Indian community in Jeddah and the world at large; through balanced, multifaceted and meaningful education of its youth. The school currently has on its rolls about 10, 500 students, 400 teachers and 100 support-staff all of them forming a cohesive family headed by the Principal.

At IISJ education from Class KG to XII is imparted. The teachers, students and other staff of the School have together created a healthy educational atmosphere in which the physical as well as intellectual abilities of every student are enhanced in totality.

The curriculum of School is learner-centered. The daily activities and lessons are planned, keeping in mind the interests of the students. On the basis of this view, the Commission has recommended the teaching of optional subjects for Class XI and XII. The school shares a common syllabus and offers English as medium of instruction. The quality of teaching is kept reasonably high by an appropriate teacher-pupil ratio.

The school provides a safe and conducive environment for children to learn and develop mentally, physically, emotionally and spiritually so as to confidently face future challenges. The school is proud of its large team of dedicated teachers, sprawling campuses with technology enabled class rooms, laboratories, libraries, playfields and a massive fleet of school buses.

The school caters to developmental aspects in all stages of students' life; from the tender care and play-way learning in kindergarten to social, moral and cooperative interactions in pre-primary and primary levels. The middle, secondary and senior secondary levels see the rigors of academic growth, where good study habits with consistent efforts of self-study are stressed. At every stage students participate in a large variety of awareness program and competitions which aim to motivate every student and reward excellence in scholastic and co-scholastic activities.

The final frontier that our students brave is the class XII CBSE examination, for which IISJ fields about 500 students every year. ## Admission Information

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- **Parents/Candidates are advised to read the Prospectus before filling the Registration/Admission Forms.** The information of the prospectus will be implemented according to the Rules & Regulations contained in USR and as per the decision of School Management.
- Admission is restricted to children of Indian Nationals only. Admission to students of other nationalities may be considered subject to seat availability only, with prior permission from the CGI – Jeddah/EOI - Riyadh.
- Registration for admission will be done on payment of SR 75.00. Copies of Iqama and passports of the student and both the parents are required. For classes II & above, Transfer Certificate and Progress Card of the previous class duly attested by DEO/any appropriate authority must be attached.
- Admission is offered on the basis of priority of registration, performance of the candidate in the admission test and in the light of the criteria laid down by the school. The test / interview is conducted according to the schedule given at the time of registration.
- A student coming from CBSE/other Boards is required to appear for a test. On qualifying the test he /she will be admitted on submission of the School Leaving Certificate duly attested by authorized District Educational Authorities and Report Card showing pass in all subjects including Hindi and III Lang.
- **Documents in original (passport and Iqama) authenticating the residential status of the pupil and the parents in KSA must be produced at the time of registration for verification. Latest photocopies of passport and Iqama must be submitted as and when they are renewed.**
- Student's name and date of birth shall be entered in the Admission & Withdrawal Register in words and figures on the basis of entries in the School Leaving Certificate / Passport. No alteration in the name or date of birth or other entries in the Admission & Withdrawal Register will be permitted after the student is formally admitted.
- Admission to classes IX-XII will be done strictly according to CBSE rules. Students, who do not fulfill the attendance criteria for the academic year, will not be admitted in any case.
- Students seeking admission to class IX & XI must submit the Board registration copy along with the prescribed fee.
- Students seeking admission in different streams in class XI will be considered subject to the availability of seats, the criteria for stream allotment set by the School and Eligibility Test.
- Admission of Makkah residents is permitted from class IV onwards only.

## Co-curricular Activities

Co-curricular Activities are integral to academic development. The school provides for a wide range of activities, the **Literary Club** conducts elocutions, recitations debates, the **Science Club** focuses on model making, projects and exhibitions, **Cultural and Social Clubs** aim to build leadership and organizational skills through conduct of special assemblies, seminars and awareness programmers such as Earth Day, Teachers' Day, Constitution Day etc.

Students participate in inter-school debates, quizzes, olympiads and science projects conducted by various organizations.

Students are divided into four houses – Red, Green, Blue and Yellow. This system inculcates the spirit of friendly competition and the urge to excel.

Wide range of competitions are conducted related to every subject of the curriculum including Qirat and Islamic quiz, Art and Craft, Computer Creativity and Heritage Quiz.

Games and Sports are essential for maintaining the physical and emotional wellbeing of a child. Inter-house competitions in various games and athletics are held which culminate in the Annual Athletic Meet, CBSE Cluster meet and Nationals conducted in India.

Excursions and picnics are conducted from time to time.

## Fee Structure - Note

- If any parent pays the total fee of his child for all the 12 months together in advance for the whole academic year from April 01 to March 31, then a discount of 7.5% will be given on the tuition fee only. If any parent pays the fee for half of the academic year in advance from April 01 to September 30 or October 01 to March 31 then a discount of 5% will be given on the tuition fee only. All other fees except tuition fee will be paid in full.

## Fee Payment Schedule

- All fees are payable on or before the last day of every calendar month.
  - The fee for the month of March should be paid along with the fee for February. All fees payable for the complete academic year for students of KG to VIII, IX&XI should be paid before declaration of the annual exam result. Board going students (X & XII) should pay the fee for February and March before collecting their hall tickets.
  - Late fee will be charged at the rate of SR 1/- for every day of default (for each child whose fee is not paid) after the last day of every month. Default payment for every completed month will be SR. 30/-. After the maximum default of 2 months the student's name will be struck off the rolls. And for the reactivation of name SR 100/- will be charged in addition to Late Fee.
  - Tuition fee will be charged from the beginning of session for the whole academic year. If any part of the fee has been paid in any of the CBSE affiliated schools / equivalently recognized school that part of fees may be condoned on production of authentic documents duly countersigned by the DEO/any appropriate authority and the fee in such cases may be charged from the date of admission.
  - Full fee will be charged for all students including every sibling.
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- **Fee Refund Rules**
    - (i) In case cancellation of admission is made within a month from the date of admission, 80% of the admission fees will be refunded.
    - (ii) In case of application for cancellation of admission after one month of admission, but before three months, only Tuition and Science lab. Fee (only for 3 months) and full examination fee will be refunded.
    - (iii) Application for cancellation of admission and for refund of fee, if submitted after three months from the date of admission, shall not be entertained.
    - (iv) In case the name of a student is struck off within one month after admission, according to the school rules all the charges will be refunded except the admission fee.





## Promotion Rules

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### For Classes I- V

1. The school follows the policy of promotion from Class I to Class V subject to the condition that the student puts in the required percentage of attendance in the full academic year.
2. It is required for the students to write the two periodic assessments, Half Yearly and the Annual Examination except for a genuine reason.
3. A student may be retained in the same class under one of the following circumstances:
  - (a) The parents make a special written request that the student should be allowed to repeat the class provided he / she comes under the recommended age group.
  - (b) The class teacher strongly recommends repetition of the class by the child for adequate academic improvement.

### For Classes VI-X

Prevailing promotion rules of CBSE will be followed.

### For Class XI

1. A student is declared pass if he/she secures a minimum of 33% marks in theory and 33% marks in practical(whenever applicable).
2. Students placed in compartment examination in a subject involving practical work are required to reappear only in the failing portion i.e. either theory or practical in the compartment examination.

### Compartment Examination for Class XI

1. Students failing in any **one** subject in class XI will be eligible for compartment examination.
2. Students failing in **two or more subjects** will be detained in the same class.
3. For promotion, a student must secure a minimum of 33% marks in the compartment examination.

### Other Information:

- The candidates who have failed or have been detained consecutively twice in (the annual exams of) class VI - IX & XI or who did not appear in the exams, will not be eligible for renewal of the admission.
- The internal students of class X who have to appear in the compartment exams , have to submit their application forms for Class XI. The students, who pass the compartmental exams with the required percentage of marks, will get the renewal of admission within 10 days after the results are declared. There will be no renewal of admission thereafter.
- The students of Classes X & XII who have been debarred from appearing in the board exams due to shortage of attendance will have to complete the formalities of re-admission for the next academic session by the stipulated date.
- The students who were not allowed to appear in the annual exams due to shortage of attendance should fulfill the formalities of the renewal of admission for the next academic session by the stipulated date.

## School Facilities

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International Indian School, Jeddah has separate blocks for the students of the Kindergarten, Primary, Middle and Senior level. Each block features a number of facilities designed to meet the specific requirements of the students.

### Classrooms

### Libraries

### Counselling Cells

Counselling Cells has been established in both the girls and boys blocks to help the students to resolve Emotional, Social or Behavioural problems. We have full time counsellors to facilitate our students to work through their difficulties such that they could optimally utilize their potential.

### Canteen

The school canteen offers nutritious, hygienic and healthy food items at affordable prices. Canteen facilities are provided to students of both the blocks.

### Medical Rooms

The school has well equipped medical rooms with the best of first-aid facilities. Each block has qualified nurses to attend to the medical needs of the students. Any emergency is referred to the nearby hospital.

### Security System & CCTV Surveillance

The safety and security of our children is our priority in school. In order to provide a secure environment for our students, the school has taken the initiative to install CCTV cameras around the school campus to ensure safety at all times. We have well trained security guards who guard the school premises round the clock.
