Subject: CBSE Board Examination Pattern for Class X (Effective from AY-2025-26) - UPDATED

Dear Parents and Students,

As per the CBSE notification dated June 25, 2025 and the FAQs on the Two Board Examination Policy released in Nov, 2025, please be informed that starting from the Academic Session 2025-26, the Class X Board Examination will be conducted in two phases: The main highlights are as follows:

1. Main Examination (Phase I)


- Compulsory for all Class X students
- To be held from 17/02/2026 to 10/03/2026
- Internal assessments will be conducted only once, prior to this phase.

2. Improvement/Second Examination (Phase II)

- To be conducted tentatively from 15/05/2026 to 01/06/2026.
- Optional - For the students who passed the First Main Exam and wish to improve performance in any 3 main subjects out of Science, Maths, Social Science and a Language.
- The best score in each subject from the two phases will be considered for the Final Result.
- The second examination will be the First Chance Compartment Examination for the students upto two failed subjects of the First Main Examination.

Sub:- Two Board Examinations in Class X from 2026- regarding

Background

Para 4.37 of National Education Policy-2020 stipulate that **“To further eliminate the ‘high stakes’ aspect of Board Exams, all students will be allowed to take Board Exams on up to two occasions during any given school year, one main examination and one for improvement, if desired.”**

Further, in PARA 4.38 it is mentioned that **“In addition to introducing greater flexibility, student choice, and best-of-two attempts, assessments that primarily test core capacities must be the immediate key reforms to all Board exams. Boards may over time also develop further viable models of Board Exams that reduce pressure and the coaching culture. Some possibilities include: a system of annual/semester/modular Board Exams could be developed - that each test far less material, and are taken immediately after the corresponding course is taken in school - so that the pressure from exams is better distributed, less intense, and less high-stakes across the Secondary Stage; all subjects and corresponding assessments, beginning with mathematics, could be offered at two levels, with students doing some of their subjects at the standard level and some at a higher level; and Board exams in certain subjects could be redesigned to have two parts – one part of an objective type with multiple-choice questions and the other of a descriptive type.”**

Decision by the CBSE

As per the recommendations of the NEP-2020 and stakeholders consultations, CBSE has decided to implement the policy of two Board Examinations in Class X from 2026 examinations.

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Scheme of Two Board Examinations

(i). General Conditions

1. It is mandatory for all the students to appear in the first Board examination.
2. All passed and eligible students will be allowed to improve their performance in any of the three subjects out of Science, Mathematics, Social Science and languages.
3. If a student has not appeared in 3 or more subjects in first examination, then s/he will not be allowed to appear in the 2nd examination. Such students will be placed in the "Essential Repeat" category and can take the examination only next year in the main examinations in the month of February next year.
4. For students whose result in the first examination is Compartment, such students will be allowed to appear in second examination under Compartment Category.
5. Additional Subjects will not be permitted after passing class X, students will not be allowed in stand-alone subjects.

(ii). Scheme for Special Category

1. Sports students will be allowed to appear in 2nd examinations in the subjects whose examinations have coincides with their sports event.
2. Winter Bound Schools' students may choose to appear either in first examinations or second examinations in offered subjects.
3. The facilities extended to CWSN candidates will be extended in 2nd examinations also.

(iii). Conduct of Internal Assessment

1. Internal assessment will be conducted only once before the main examinations.

(iv). Schedule of the Examinations

1. Main or 1st examinations will begin from Mid-February as conducted now.
2. Second examination will be conducted in the month of May.



(v). Eligibility Criteria for Appearing in the Examinations

1. First examination will be the main examination. The eligibility to appear in the first examination will be:
 - (a) Fresh students of Class X
 - (b) Second Chance Compartment
 - (c) Essential Repeat of previous year
 - (d) Improvement examination
2. The eligibility to appear in the second examination will be:
 - (a) Improvement category up to 3 main subjects
 - (b) First/Third Chance Compartment
 - (c) Compartment + Improvement
 - (d) Improvement for the students passed by the replacement of the subject.

(vi). Syllabus and Scheme of Examinations

1. Both the examinations will be conducted on the full syllabus meant for the year.
2. The scheme of studies and scheme of examinations will remain the same.

(vii). LOC Submission for the examinations

1. Filling of LOC and appearing in the Main/first examination will be compulsory.
2. LOC for the 2nd examinations will be filled in separately. However, no new names will be added to the LOC of the 2nd examination.
3. Subject change will not be allowed from first examination to second examinations except permitted as per policy.

(viii). Result Declaration

1. Result of all the students will be declared as per Examination Bye-Laws.
2. Result of First examinations will be declared in the month of April.



3. Result of second examinations will be declared in the month of June.
4. Performance of main examination will be made available in DigiLocker. This could be used for admission to class XI if the student does not wish to appear in 2nd examinations for improvement. Passing document will be issued to all the students after the results of Second examinations.
5. Merit certificate will also be issued only after second examination.

(ix). Post Result Facilities


1. Facilities of Photocopy, verification and re-evaluation will be available only after declaration of results of 2nd examination for both the examinations i.e. Main and 2nd examinations.

(x). Admission in Class XI

1. Students not qualified in the main examination will be allowed provisional admission in Class XI and based on the result of the 2nd examination, their admission will be confirmed.

All schools are accordingly directed to bring the policy of two examinations 2025-2026 to the notice of parents and students and to orient them well about the policy. It is also directed to collect all relevant data correctly from students for filling up of LOC with correct subjects offered by them.

As Board will hold two examinations, hence, it is desired from the parents, students and schools that they will take ensure timely completion of all the activities with correct data.

As per NEP 2020, CBSE has introduced the Two Examination policy in class-X from session 2025- 2026. It is a new policy and will be implemented for the first time. Hence, there is a necessity that stakeholders are made well aware of this policy not only for better implementation but for the ease of the stakeholders. Being a new policy, here is a possibility that stakeholders may have certain queries.

Accordingly, CBSE has developed FAQs to make the policy more & more clear to its stakeholders. After going through these FAQs, if certain other doubts remain, that stakeholders may wish to clarify, they may mail it on the following email id- queries2be@cbseshiksha.in

Question	Answer
1. What is the rationale behind the 2 Board Examination for Class X?	<p>The NEP 2020 states that “To further eliminate the ‘high stakes’ aspect of Board Exams, all students will be allowed to take Board Exams on up to two occasions during any given school year, one main examination and one for improvement, if desired.”</p> <p>In order to implement the true essence of NEP 2020, the Board has come out with the two-examination policy for Class X from 2026.</p>
2. From which academic Session will the Policy be implemented?	The 2 Board Examination Policy will be implemented from the 2025-2026 academic session. This implies all candidates appearing for Class X examination in 2026 will have this opportunity, if they desire so.
3. Will candidates placed in Compartment category in the year 2025 results also be allowed to appear in the Second Board examination 2026 if they miss the Main Examination 2026 for any reason?	As 03 opportunities are provided to the students placed in compartment, hence for the students main or the first exam would be the second opportunity, and the Second Board Exam will be the third and last opportunity. Hence, they will be allowed in Second Board Examination.
4. If candidates of 2025 who wish to improve their performance will they be allowed to improve in 2 nd Board Exam in May 2026.	No, for all such students, they will have the chance to appear only in the Main Examinations to be held in February/March 2026.

5. Do all students appearing for the Main examination 2026 need to appear for the Second Board Examination?	<p>No, if any student is unable to perform well in the first examination, they may decide to appear in Second Board examination.</p> <p>It is advised to all students & parents that students should prepare well for the Main examination and make best efforts to perform well in the first examination.</p> <p>Further, the role of the school is to make a conducive environment where learners can remain stress free and should not be pressured to appear for the second examinations to secure more marks just for the sake of better school performance for publicity etc.</p>
6. What will be the schedule of the Two Examinations? OR When will these two Examinations be held by the Board?	<p>The Main Examinations will be held from 17/02/2026 to 10/03/2026.</p> <p>The Second Examination will be conducted tentatively from 15/05/2026 to 01/06/2026.</p>
7. What are the Conditions of the 2 Board Policy?	<p>The Most important Condition of the Two Board Examination Policy is that the First Main Examination to be held in February / March is mandatory for all Candidates of Class X. This implies that all students studying in Class X will have to appear for the First Examination to become eligible for the Second examination.</p> <p>Detailed eligibility conditions for candidates for appearing in the Second Board exam alongwith illustrations are given at ANNEXURE I</p>
8. Who can appear for the First Examination?	<p>The following category of students can appear for the First examination to be held in Feb/March 2026.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (a) Fresh students of Class X (b) Second Chance Compartment (c) Essential Repeat of previous year (d) Improvement examination for students passed in 2025
9. Who can appear for the Second Examination?	<p>The following category of students can appear for the Second examination to be held in May 2026.</p>

	<p>(i) Improvement category up to 3 main subjects i.e. Science, Social Studies, Maths & a Language.</p> <p>(ii) First/Third Chance Compartment</p> <p>(iii) Compartment + Improvement</p> <p>(iv) Improvement for the students passed by the replacement of the subject.</p> <p>However, appearing in first examination is a mandatory condition.</p>
10.What is the Eligibility for appearing in the Second Examination?	<p>Eligibility for appearing in Second examination is that a student must have appeared in the first examination and status of the result is as follows:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Passed Class X 2. Placed in compartment category. 3. Passed Class X by replacing with the 6th subject.
11.When will a student not be allowed to appear in the Second examination?	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. If a student has not appeared in the First Examination due to any reasons. 2. If a student has not appeared because of any reasons / failed in 3 or more subjects in the First Examination then he/she will not be allowed to appear for the Second examination. 3. Students placed in the ER category will not be eligible for the Second Examination, they will be allowed next year in the main examinations.
12.What will happen to a student who remains absent in the First Examination?	<p>All such candidates who do not appear in 3 or more subjects in the First Examination because of any reasons will not be allowed to appear for the Second examination. Such students will be placed in the “Essential Repeat” category and will be eligible to take the examination only next year in the Main Examinations in the month of February/March.</p>
13.Can a student appear in all 5/6/7 subjects opted for in the Second Examinations?	<p>Students who pass and are eligible will be allowed for improving their performance in any of the three subjects out of Science, Mathematics, Social Science and languages during the Second Board Examination. This implies students can</p>

	appear for improvement of performance in and up to 3 subjects.
14. Can a student appear in an additional Subject during the Second Examination?	Additional Subjects will not be permitted for the Second or subsequent Examinations after passing class X. Students will not be allowed to appear in stand-alone subjects. As there is a provision of internal assessment in the subjects & student will not have appeared for the Internal assessment, hence, no additional subject will be allowed.
15. Can a student change his/ her subject while appearing for the Second Examinations?	No. Subject Change will not be allowed for the Second Examination being conducted by the Board.
16. Can a student opt for Improvement in all 3 languages he/she opts for?	No, a student can only appear for improvement in any of the 1 language that he may have opted for, if not placed in compartment in any language.
17. Can a student opt for Improvement in 2 languages he/she has as subjects?	No, a student can only appear for improvement in any of the 1 language out of the 2/3 languages being studied.
18. Can a student opt for Improvement in 1 language he/she has as a subject?	Yes, a student can opt for only 1 language in the Second Board Examination for improvement.

19. Will a special Examination for candidates appearing in National/ International Sports and Olympiad be conducted by the Board?	Sports students will be allowed to appear in the Second Examination in the subjects whose examinations may have coincided with their sports event during the conduct of the Main Examinations. So, a special examination for such candidates will not be held separately.
20. If a student is unable to appear in 3 subjects due to illness or hospitalization or any such reasons, can such a student be allowed to appear for the Second Board Examination?	No, if a student is absent in 3 or more subjects due to any reasons, the student will be placed in the Essential Repeat category. Such students can only appear for examination in the subsequent year.

21.As a CWSN candidate will I get the same Facilities as earlier in both the Examinations?	YES. The facilities extended to CWSN candidates in the Main Examination will be extended in the Second Examinations also.
22.When will Internal Assessment be conducted? Will it also be conducted twice for the two examinations?	Internal assessment will be conducted only once before the main examinations. Marks will be uploaded as per schedule. There is no provision of improvement in the Internal Assessment.
23.What will be the syllabus for the First Examination?	The first examinations will be conducted on the full syllabus meant for the year.
24.What will be the syllabus for the Second Examination?	The second examinations will also be conducted on the full syllabus meant for the year.
25.Will LOC be filled in for both the examinations separately?	YES, Filling of LOC and appearing in the Main/first examination will be compulsory. LOC for the Second examinations will be filled in separately. However, no new names will be added to the LOC of the Second examination
26.What will happen if the LOC for the First Examination is not filled by any school?	For any school not filling the LOC of the First Examinations, Such Candidates will not be able to appear in any examination conducted by the Board in that year.
27.When will the Results of these examinations be declared?	Result of First examination is proposed to be declared in the month of April. Result of Second examination is proposed to be declared in the month of June.
28.What if some student wants to appear in the Second examination after declaration of first exam result?	The student/ school can fill the LOC for the Second examination for all such students immediately soon after the facility of LOC submission for the second exams is started by the CBSE.
29.Can a new name be added to the LOC for the Second examination?	No new names can be added in the LOC for the Second examination.

<p>30. Will I get my Marksheet after result declaration if I do not wish to appear in the Second Examination?</p>	<p>Performance of main/first examination will be made available in Digi Locker. This could be used for admission to class XI if the student does not wish to appear in the Second examinations. Passing document will be issued to all the students after the results of Second examination only.</p> <p>Documents available in Digi Locker could be used after 1st examination for any or all purpose.</p>
<p>31. If a student is placed in the Merit List, when will she/he get the merit certificate?</p>	<p>Merit certificate will be issued only after second examination.</p>
<p>32. If a student wish to apply for Photocopy or rechecking and re-evaluation after the first examination, will she/he be able to do so after 1st exam?</p>	<p>Facilities of Photocopy, verification and re-evaluation will be available only after declaration of results of Second examination for both the examinations i.e. Main and Second Examinations.</p>
<p>33. Can a student take admission to Class XI if she/he placed in compartment category and wish to appear for the Second examinations?</p>	<p>Students not qualified in the main examination and placed under compartment category will be allowed provisional admission in Class XI and based on the result of the Second examination; their admission will be confirmed in Class XI.</p>

ANNEXURE I
