## THE CONSTITUTION OF INDIA

### PREAMBLE

WE, THE PEOPLE OF INDIA, having solemnly resolved to constitute India into a SOVEREIGN SOCIALIST SECULAR DEMOCRATIC REPUBLIC and to secure to all its citizens:

JUSTICE, social, economic and political;

LIBERTY of thought, expression, belief, faith and worship;

EQUALITY of status and of opportunity; and to promote among them all.

FRATERNITY assuring the dignity of the individual and the unity and integrity of the Nation;

IN OUR CONSTITUENT ASSEMBLY this twenty-sixth day of November, 1949, DO HEREBY ADOPT, ENACT AND GIVE TO OURSELVES THIS CONSTITUTION.

### **Part-IV-A FUNDAMENTAL DUTIES**

#### Article 51-A

**It shall be the duty of every citizen of India-**

- a. To abide by the Constitution and respect its ideals and institutions, the National Flag and the National Anthem;
- b. To cherish and follow the noble ideals which inspired our national struggle for freedom;
- c. To uphold and protect the sovereignty, unity and integrity of India;
- d. To defend the country and render national service when called upon to do so;
- e. To promote harmony and the spirit of common brotherhood amongst all the people of India transcending religious, linguistic and regional or sectional diversities; to renounce practices derogatory to the dignity of women;
- f. To value and preserve the rich heritage of our composite culture;
- g. To protect and improve the natural environment including forests, lakes, rivers and wild life, and to have compassion for living creatures;

## **About the School**

International Indian School Jeddah, formerly known as the Embassy of India School, was founded in 1969. It made a very humble beginning with a limited number of students, staff and infrastructural facilities in a makeshift area. The objective of establishing the school was to impart quality education to the children of Indian nationals residing in Jeddah. With the blessings of the Almighty and constant efforts put in by well-wishers, the school expanded in a phenomenal manner. Currently the school has separate Boys, Girls and KG Sections catering to the educational needs of about 10,500 students.

## **Curriculum**

The school follows the CBSE curriculum. It is affiliated to the Central Board of Secondary Education, New Delhi and prepares the students for All India Secondary School Examination (Std. X) and All India Senior School Certificate Examination (Std. XII). The medium of instruction is English.

### **I. Foundational Stage**

As per the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, the Foundational Stage focuses on holistic development through play-based, activity-oriented, and experiential learning. Emphasis is laid on language and literacy, early numeracy, physical well-being, socio-emotional development, creativity, and environmental awareness.

### **II. Primary and Secondary Level**

These sections help the children in the holistic development of their personality. Equal stress is laid on academics and values. In the classroom, the child is encouraged to comprehend and apply rather than memorize, to enjoy learning, develop regular study habits, think independently with logic and reason. The Subjects taught are English, Hindi, Mathematics, EVS, Science, Social Science, Third Languages (Urdu, Arabic, Malayalam, Tamil, Telugu and Kannada), Computer Science, AI, Art and Craft, Physical Education, Saudi Arabian Culture, Islamic Studies, General Arabic, Moral Science, General knowledge, Life Skills etc.

### **III. Senior Secondary Level**

At this level students are prepared for higher learning. Emphasis is laid on strengthening the knowledge in subjects such as English, Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics, Biology, Informatics Practices, Computer Science, Economics, Business Studies, Accountancy, History, Geography, Marketing, Physical Education, Home Science, Sociology, Urdu, Arabic, General Arabic, Islamic Civilisation & SAC based on the group opted by the students.

#### **Co-curricular Activities**

Besides academics, students have facilities for adequate exposure to the following co-curricular activities: Literary and Cultural, Art, Yoga, Athletics, Cricket, Chess, Badminton, Football, Table Tennis, Volleyball, Basketball, Kho-Kho etc.

Students are divided into four different houses (Red, Green, Blue & Yellow). This system inculcates in the students the spirit of friendly competition, the urge to excel in Sportsmanship and leadership qualities.

The school offers ample opportunities for students to develop a sound body which is essential for a sound mind. Various Inter-house and Inter-school sports, Debates, Science Projects and Quiz Competitions are conducted periodically.

#### **Scouts & Guides Movement – Creating a Better World.**

The purpose of the Movement is to contribute to the development of young people in achieving their full Physical, Intellectual, Emotional, Social and Spiritual potential as individuals, as responsible Citizens and as members of local, national and international communities. To impart Life Skills to the Students the school has a full-fledged 'Bharat Scouts and Guides' unit operating under National Head Quarters-India.

The movement now has the enrolment of students from grades I to X, who are guided by trained staff members who have completed training back in India. The units at various levels are as follows: -

Scouts (boys) and Guides (girls): For students of grades VI –X.

Cubs (boys) and Bulbuls (girls): For students of grades III – V

Bunnies (boys & girls): For students of grades I & II.

Within the unit there is gradual advancement of students from one level to the next higher level on completion of the course designed for the timeframe provided by the headquarters.

### **Library**

There are well-stocked Libraries with Book lending facilities and E-library for Students' use. Newspapers, Magazines and Journals on Current Affairs, Science, Sports and Education are subscribed.

### **Laboratories**

Well-equipped Laboratories for Science, Physics, Chemistry, Biology, Home Science, Geography and Computer Science offer the Students avenues for experimentation and learning through practice.

### **Facilities Offered**

#### **Medical Rooms**

The school has well equipped Medical Rooms with the best of First-Aid facilities. Each School building has qualified Nurses to attend to the medical needs of the students. Any emergency is referred to the nearby Hospital/ Polyclinic. The students are charged SR.15/- per year for the First-Aid facility.

School Counselors are available to assist Students at all levels, from Primary to Senior Secondary in both the Sections. They act as advocates for Students' well-being, and as valuable resources for their Educational advancement and listen to students' concerns about Academic, Emotional or Social problems.

### **Special Educator:**

Our school is committed to the inclusive education of Children With Special Needs (CWSN).

Specialized support services, individualized attention, and a nurturing environment are provided to ensure their holistic development.

### **School Canteen:**

Canteen provides Hygienic, Healthy & Fresh food items to the Students.

### **Security System & CCTV Surveillance:**

The Safety and Security of our children is our priority in school. In order to provide a secure environment for our students, the school has taken the initiative to install CCTV cameras around the school campus to ensure safety at all times. We have well trained Security Guards who guard the School Premises round the clock.

## ADMISSION

1. Admission is restricted to children of Indian Nationals only.
2. Registration for New Admission will be done on payment of SR. 75.00. Copies of Valid Iqama, and Passports of the Student and both the Parents are required. For classes II & above, Transfer Certificate and Progress Card of previous Class are required.
3. Admission is offered on the basis of priority of Registration, Performance of the candidate in the Admission Test and in the light of the criteria laid down by the School. The Test / Interview is conducted according to the schedule given at the time of Registration.
4. **Documents in original (Passport, Absher Iqama) authenticating the Residential status of the Student and the Parents in KSA must be produced at the time of Registration for verification. Latest Photocopies of the Passport and Absher Iqama must be submitted as and when they are renewed.**
5. Student's Name and Date of Birth will be entered in the Admission & Withdrawal Register in words and figures on the basis of entries in the School Leaving Certificate / Passport. No alteration in the Name or Date of Birth or other entries in the Admission & Withdrawal Register will be permitted after the student is formally admitted.
6. Admission will be carried out strictly according to CBSE rules. Students, who do not fulfil the Attendance criteria for the Academic year, will not be admitted in any case.
7. Admission to grades (IX–XII) will be considered as Provisional. Regularisation of Admission will be subjected to approval by CBSE.
8. Admission in different Streams in Class XI will be subjected to availability of Seats, The Minimum Qualifying Criteria set by the School and the Admission Test.

## **Removal from School Rolls and Re-admission**

### **Fee Default**

If the fee for a particular month remains unpaid by the end of the Month, the student will be classified as a Fee Defaulter starting from the First day of the following Month.

In the event that the School Fee, including any applicable Late Fee, remains unpaid for a continuous period of 02 months, a Re-Admission fee of SR. 50.00 will be charged besides recovering other fees and the late fee dues.

### **Absence**

All Students are expected to attend School regularly and must not be Absent without prior approval. If a Student intends to take leave, they must submit a Leave Application, which can be downloaded from the school website. However, submitting a Leave Application does not imply approval; the leave is considered granted only upon explicit approval from the School.

### **Cancellation of Transfer Certificate & Re-admission**

If a Student takes a Transfer Certificate but decides later to Re-join within 30 days, then He/ She may be allowed to re-join upon payment of SR 100/- as a Cancellation charge for the Transfer Certificate.

In case a Student takes the Transfer Certificate but wishes to Re-join the same Class in the New Session, then by virtue of the student still holding the same TC of IISJ, The case may be considered as TC cancellation and Re - Admission and in that case 50% of the normal Admission Fee will be charged from the Student.

In case a Student takes TC and joins any other School and comes back with the TC of that School, then the case will be treated as New Admission. This and all similar cases not falling in the category of Cancellation of TC or Re - Admission will be treated as New Admissions. Normal fee for new admission will be charged in all such cases.

## Withdrawal from School

1. Parents seeking withdrawal of a student should notify the school at least 15 days in advance for processing the Transfer Certificate (TC).
2. Parents of students of Grade X who wish to apply for a Transfer Certificate (TC) should do so within one month of the declaration of results.
3. In case of delay, fees will be charged up to the month of submission of the TC application.
4. Any adjustment to the above shall be subjected to the discretion of the competent authority, with a minimum delay charge of SR. 200/-.

## **Fee Payment Schedule**

1. All fees are payable on or before the last day of every calendar month.
2. The fee for the month of March should be paid along with the fee for February. All fees payable for the complete academic year for students of Nursery to VIII, IX & XI should be paid before declaration of the annual exam result. Board going students (X & XII) should pay the fee for February and March before collecting their hall tickets.
3. Late fee will be charged at the rate of SR.1/- for every day of default (for each child whose fee is not paid) after the last day of every month. Default payment for the completed month will be subject to a maximum of SR. 30/-.
4. Tuition fee will be charged from the beginning of session for the whole academic year. If any part of the fee has been paid in any of the CBSE affiliated schools in KSA or GCC countries that part of fees may be condoned on production of authentic documents and the fee in such cases may be charged from the date of admission. However, all other fee will be charged from beginning of the academic year.
5. Full fee will be charged for all students including every sibling.

## **Fee Refund Rules**

- (i) In case cancellation of admission is made within a month from the date of admission, 80% of the admission fees will be refunded.
- (ii) In case of application for cancellation of admission after one month of admission, but before three months, only Tuition and full examination fee will be refunded.
- (iii) Application for cancellation of admission and for refund of fee, if submitted after three months from the date of admission, shall not be entertained.
- (iv) In case the name of a student is struck off within one month after admission, according to the school rules all the charges will be refunded except the admission fee.

## Students Discipline Policy

- ☞ **Regularity:**  
Students must maintain regular attendance throughout the academic year. Absence without prior permission or a valid reason will be viewed seriously and treated as a breach of school discipline. Parents must submit a leave application along with supporting documents such as a medical certificate. Irregular attendance may lead to disciplinary action and may affect promotion or participation in school activities.
- ☞ **Punctuality:**  
Students must report to school on time every day. Late coming will not be permitted except in genuine cases supported by valid justification. Repeated late arrivals will invite strict disciplinary action, including warnings, notes in the school diary, and denial of entry to the class.
- ☞ Students must come to school in proper uniform as prescribed in the school diary.
- ☞ **Students are expected to converse only in English.**
- ☞ Students are not supposed to leave the school premises without genuine reason and valid permission of the concerned HM.
- ☞ All the students should have full awareness of personal hygiene. They should maintain proper hair cut / hairdo. Dyeing of hair is not allowed.
- ☞ Students are expected to be social, polite and courteous with their peers and the school staff. They should refrain from arrogant and violent behaviour under all circumstances. Zero tolerance towards fighting, beating & bullying in the school campus.
- ☞ The school is for the students. Therefore, every student should have a sense of belonging. He / She must utilize the school facilities like, the school bus, classrooms, libraries, laboratories etc, in a desired manner. No student should cause any damage to the school property. Any such damage caused will be made good by recovering the cost from the student.
- ☞ Students are not supposed to bring to school any material that is not relevant to academics. Possessing undesirable materials, Party snow spray, i-Pads, i-Pods, Cameras, CDs, Mobile Phones, Smart Watches, Pen Drives, Laptop, any objectionable printed material, firecrackers, explosives, vape, UNO cards, objectionable books etc., would be considered a serious offence and would be confiscated. Appropriate disciplinary action including rustication will be taken based on the seriousness of the offence.

## **Library**

1. Silence should be strictly observed in the Library.
2. Students should not bring any Book of their own into the Library.
3. Students are not allowed to keep any Book issued from the library for more than a week; otherwise they are liable to be fined SR.2.00 per day for each book.
4. Students can get the book Re-issued for a further period if that book is not in demand.
5. The Librarian may call for a book at any time even if the normal period for which the book is issued has not expired.
6. If a Book is lost or damaged, the student will have to make good the loss / damage by paying SR 20/- as penalty (At the Fee Counter).
7. It is strictly forbidden to tear a Leaf, Write any remark in a book or to underline the words. If there are already such writings in a book or a leaf is torn, it should be brought to the notice of the Librarian immediately on receipt of the book, and not later.
8. Proper care of the Library Books should be taken.
9. Reference books like Dictionary and Encyclopaedia cannot be taken home.
10. Students should not exchange library books amongst themselves.

## **Laboratory**

The school has separate Laboratories for Science, Physics, Chemistry, Biology, Computer Science, Informatics Practices, Home Science and Geography. Students should observe the following rules while working in the laboratories:

1. Follow the instructions given by the teacher and the Laboratory Assistant.
2. Report any breakage or loss immediately to the teacher in charge.
3. Bring proper Record Books and observation Note Books to the Laboratory.
4. Hand over the Chemicals & Apparatus taken for the experiment to the lab assistant.
5. Handle the Equipment and chemicals very carefully. (Carelessness in this regard may cause harm / damage to person or the apparatus).The students will be responsible for any breakage or loss of apparatus issued to him/her. If the damage / breakage / loss cannot be immediately fixed individually, a collective fine will be imposed on all the students of the concerned batch / class.

## Examination Rules

1. A Student is eligible to take the Annual Examination only if he/she has 75% of Attendance, counted from the opening of the Academic Session up to the last working day of the month preceding the month in which the Examination commences.

Shortage of Attendance up to 15% may be condoned for classes KG to VIII by the Principal on the recommendation of the concerned H.M. based on valid reasons.

The following may be considered as valid reasons:

- (a) Prolonged illness – supported with medical certificate.
  - (b) Loss of father/mother or some other such incident leading to his/her absence from the school and meriting special consideration.
2. It is mandatory to clear all Fee Dues before the Final Examination.
  3. Students suffering from infectious diseases will not be allowed to attend School or appear for the test /examination.
  4. Students are not permitted to use Calculators and other Electronic Gadgets in the Examination.
  5. Whiteners and Erasable pens are not to be used on Answer Sheets. Any mistake should be scored out and the modified answer separately re-written.
  6. Bringing prohibited items into the Examination Hall and exchanging material related to exam etc., amounts to use of unfair means (UFM). Established cases will be awarded zero.
  7. Writing on the Question paper and table, self etc is prohibited and will amount to UFM (except on Self-Answering Question paper).
  8. Any incident of tampering with Examination Records will be considered as a serious offence and appropriate disciplinary action will be taken.

## Promotion Rules

### **For Classes I-V**

1. The school follows the policy of promotion from Class I to Class V subject to the condition that the student puts in the required percentage of attendance in the full academic year.
2. It is required for the students to write the two periodic assessments, Half Yearly and the Annual Examination except for a genuine reason.
3. A student may be retained in the class under any one of the following circumstances:
  - (a) The parents make a special written request that the student should be allowed to repeat the class provided he / she comes under the recommended age group.
  - (b) The class teacher strongly recommends repetition of the class by the child for adequate academic improvement.

### **For Classes VI-X**

Prevailing promotion rules of CBSE will be followed.

### **For Class XI**

1. A student is declared pass if he/she secures a minimum of 33% marks in theory and 33% marks in practical(whenever applicable).
2. Students placed in compartment examination in a subject involving practical work are required to reappear only in the failing portion i.e. either theory or practical in the compartment examination.

### **Compartment Examination for Class XI**

1. Students failing in any **One** Subject in class XI will be Eligible for Compartment Examination.
2. Students failing in **Two or more Subjects** will be Detained in the same Class.
3. For Promotion, A Student must secure a minimum of 33% marks in the Compartment Examination.

## **A Word to the Parents**

1. Regularly monitor the academic progress of their child and communicate with the concerned teachers through this diary regarding problems if any. If needed, the concerned H.M., VP or the Principal may be contacted.
2. Acknowledge every communication sent by the School by way of notes/circulars.
3. Help the child correct his/her behaviour as and when required.
4. **Ensure that the child is regular and punctual to school.** Always send a leave letter if he/she is absent from school. This will help avoid truancy, as well as, removal of name from the school rolls in case of long absence.
5. **Please don't send your children to school if they are sick.** especially during Tests. Medical Report along with leave application can be submitted later to the Class Teacher.
6. Always pay the fees and other dues on time to avoid embarrassment.
7. Attend all the Parent-Teacher Meetings and get a feedback on the progress of your ward.
8. Ensure that the child is neatly dressed and has all the prescribed books as well as stationery requirements. Do not encourage the habit of borrowing. Teach him/her the value of honesty, integrity and politeness.
9. Ensure that your child wears the ID badge to school every day.

11. Parents are requested not to go to the class rooms for any reason. They should go only to the H.M. who will help them in the matter.
12. Monitor the use of gadgets by your wards. Use of internet and social networking sites and apps should be restricted and monitored.
13. Ensure proper and healthy food habits. Encourage your child to carry home-made food to school.
14. Encourage your ward to participate in the various activities organised by the school. Guide and support them to balance between the scholastic & Co-scholastic activities.
15. Suggestions from parents on improvement of school and welfare of the children are most welcome.
16. In order to ensure the safety and security of your wards, make one fixed transport arrangement for him/her to commute to and from school. Students who commute by school bus should use only the bus to commute to and from school.
17. Parents' contact number is a must and should be available throughout. Latest changes must be updated.
